Alfresco dining transformed on Stirling Terrace

Albany residents can relax and enjoy new alfresco dining experiences thanks to innovative enhancements at Stirling Terrace.

City of Albany Executive Director of Planning and Development Services Dale Putland said staff had been working with businesses on Stirling Terrace to trial innovative alfresco dining solutions.

“It is part of our plan to activate the city centre and create more opportunities for our local business owners,” he said.

“Through the Anzac commemorations we were able to see first-hand the positive outcomes from alfresco dining along Stirling Terrace.”

The redevelopment of the laneway at the Royal George Hotel, now known as Six Degrees, created an opportunity to provide more parking and expand alfresco dining.

“With the road and parking realignments we found this created even more opportunities for alfresco dining,” Mr Putland said.

“We collaboratively came up with a design for the area, arranged line marking, and met with operators on the designs.”

Local business owners have praised the proactive approach from the City to support innovative business ideas.

The City of Albany waived the alfresco fees for the trial period and has received positive feedback from businesses.
