The Albany History Collection contains historical material documenting the Aboriginal people of the Albany region.

Visitors and researchers, PLEASE BE AWARE:

In our local Aboriginal community, hearing or seeing names of deceased persons may result in an emotional response of spiritual significance, especially to the relatives of these people. The Albany History Collection contains photographs and recordings that may cause distress to friends and family if publicly displayed. Access to sensitive records and material requires the permission of the Local History Co-ordinator.

The Albany History Collection contains records and materials that use words and descriptions that may be culturally sensitive and which might not be used in public or community contexts. Historical records documented people and cultures using early twentieth century theories, which represent people in ways which today may be considered offensive. Historical records can reflect the author's own opinion or a social attitude of the time, which may also be considered inappropriate today.

Material from the Albany History Collection concerning Aboriginal people of the Albany region should not be reproduced without permission of the relevant families.
