Horse trainers in other towns do not have access to the main town beach. Country trainers manage to train their horses without the use of a beach. It is only a matter of time before a person is seriously hurt or killed by an unpredictable horse on Middleton Beach. We have heard and have been witness to several close encounters.</p> <p>(b) The noise from the horses, their trainers and vehicles can be quiet disturbing and carries as far as the end of Hope Street.</p> <p>(c) The horses pose a danger especially in winter when it is still dark – on several occasions we have almost collided with a horse while driving. The horse riders at times ride 3 to 5 abreast across the road, blocking normal car movement. We had an incident recently when a horse threw a rider, and the horse came bolting down the path next to our house and into the back yard of our neighbour. Fortunately no one</p> | <p>(a) The proposal relates to prohibitions on the parking of horse floats, commercial vehicles and trailers. Council has previously agreed to include a horse exercise area within it's Animals Local Law which will shortly be considered by Council.
