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Lease awarded for new restaurant at Princess Royal Fortress

A high quality restaurant/cafe is expected to be operating next to the National Anzac Centre in time for the November Anzac Centenary following an Albany City Council decision last night.

Council approved a new lease for a commercial cafe and restaurant at Princess Royal Fortress to the Imperial Group Pty Ltd following a Request for Proposal process.

City of Albany Deputy CEO Garry Adams said the Imperial Group was selected because of their significant experience in managing quality food and beverage businesses.

“The proponent has demonstrated significant previous experience in managing very high quality businesses in Perth and York, and the City is confident this facility will be no different,” he said.

The restaurant/cafe is expected to be an important part of the redevelopment of Princess Royal Fortress, which – in addition to the centrepiece National Anzac Centre – will also include a new retail and administration space, landscaping enhancements (including a Memorial Garden), public space improvements and a new Convoy Walk and Lookout on Mt Adelaide.

Princess Royal Fortress will be closed for business from May 30 until mid-October while construction work on the improvements is carried out.

The area will remain accessible via walking trails and cycle ways during construction, and Carlyles Function Centre will remain open as normal.

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
