RECONNECTING MENANG
NOONGAR NAMES WITH PLACE

Mayor's Message

Traditional place names reflect history and the connection to place that is central to Indigenous Australian identity. They help to tell stories about these places.

Restoring Menang Noongar place names is an important step in reconciliation for our community and one that showcases the rich culture and traditions of our local Menang Noongar community.

Thanks to funding from Lotterywest, the City of Albany engaged Aboriginal heritage specialist Robert Reynolds, Menang Elder Vernice Gillies and local historian Dr Murray Arnold to guide research of historical documentation and collaborate with our Menang community to identify Menang Noongar place names across the Albany region.

The project acknowledges the cultural significance of places and seeks to increase awareness and knowledge of Menang language by increasing the number of geographical features and places within the City of Albany that include the Menang Noongar place name.

We are often more familiar with European place names and modern history, but there are many Menang Noongar names and stories attached to these places. These names tell of a rich connection to Country, and their importance to our First Nations people long before non-Aboriginal cultures arrived on our shores.

The Restoring Menang Noongar Place Names project has been a journey of discovery and a rekindling of cultural awareness, as we have collaborated with our local Aboriginal community to identify the names their ancestors gave these places.

This calendar enables us to recognise and appreciate the cultural significance of 12 locations, with each month featuring artwork from a local Noongar artist that captures the essence of the location.

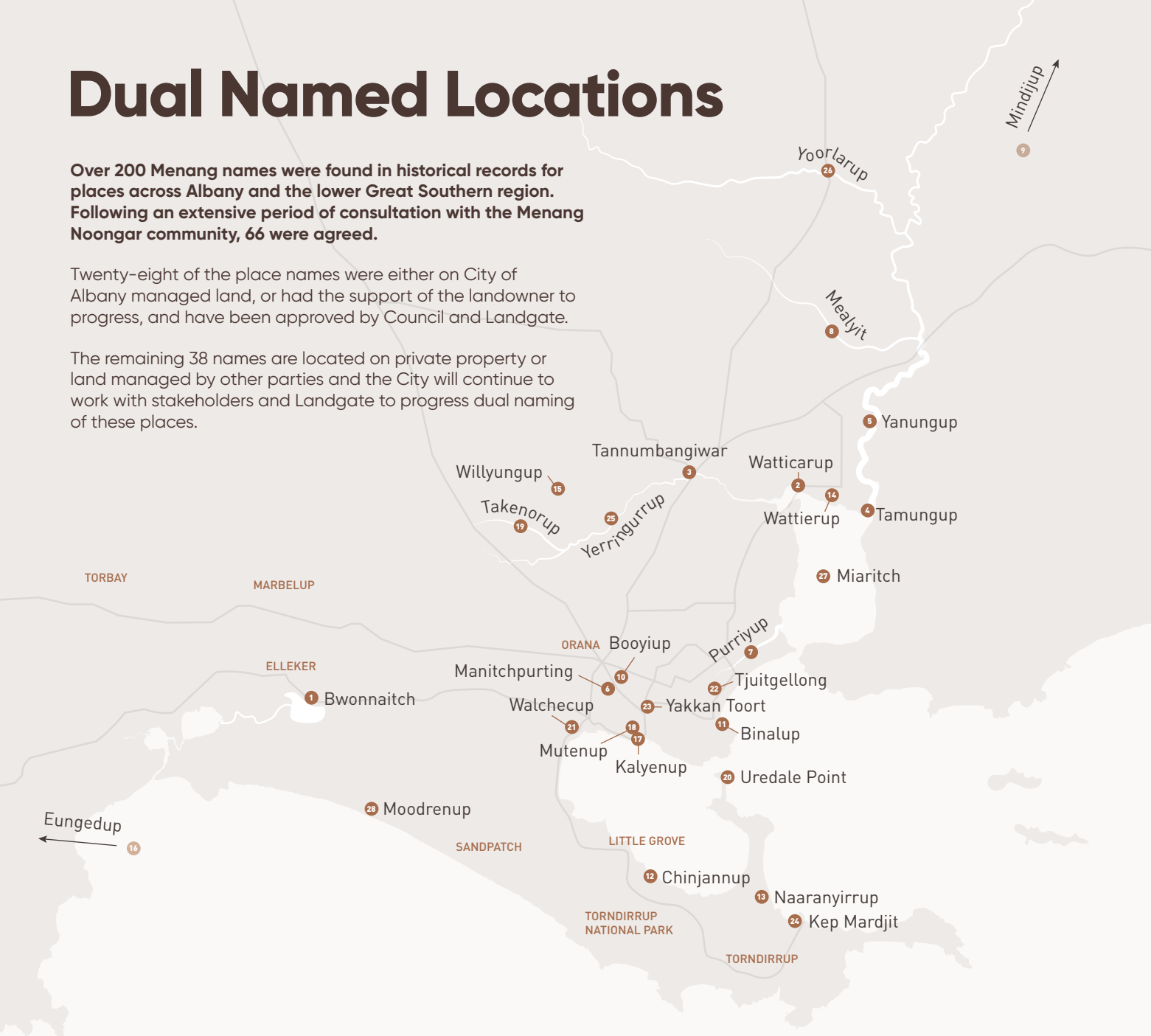


Dual Named Locations

Over 200 Menang names were found in historical records for places across Albany and the lower Great Southern region. Following an extensive period of consultation with the Menang Noongar community, 66 were agreed.

Twenty-eight of the place names were either on City of Albany managed land, or had the support of the landowner to progress, and have been approved by Council and Landgate.

The remaining 38 names are located on private property or land managed by other parties and the City will continue to work with stakeholders and Landgate to progress dual naming of these places.

URED ALE POINT

The name Point Possession has historically had connotations of Menang ownership ending when Captain George Vancouver claimed 'possession' of the land in 1791. However, a traditional Menang Noongar place name has not been identified within the local Menang community or within historical records. After consultation with the local Menang community, Point Possession has been renamed Uredale Point in honour of the most senior Aboriginal man living in the area at the time of settlement.

Uredale was well known to the British, who referred to him as Dr Uredale in sign of genuine respect for his status as both a senior man and a *Mulgaraddock* – a Menang doctor believed to have supernatural powers.

TOP TIPS TO SAVE SPACE IN YOUR GENERAL WASTE BIN

Did you know that if every person in WA reduces what we discard by just 5%, we'll each throw away about 120kg less per year – or the equivalent of 7500 adult humpback whales all together!

- Use your lime green-lidded FOGO bin for all food scraps, garden prunings, used tissues and paper towel, dirty cardboard (like pizza boxes), shredded paper, and pet poo.
- Recycle as much as you can – put all cans, flattened cardboard, paper and magazines, glass bottles and jars, and plastic bottles and containers in your yellow-lidded Recycling bin. Excess household recycling can be taken to Fossicker's Tip Shop for no charge.
- Take soft plastic packaging (like bread bags and chip packets) to the REDcycle bins at Coles & Woolworths when you do your shopping.
- Separate items that shouldn't go in any bin, such as batteries and light globes, and drop them off at Fossicker's Tip Shop for no charge.
- Look for package-free or low packaging alternatives when you shop.
- Compact waste in rubbish bags and squeeze as much air out as possible.
