Notes to and Forming Part of the Quarterly Statements For the period ending 31 March 2002

(1) SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The significant policies which have been adopted in the preparation of the Annual Budget are:-

(a) Basis of Accounting

These budget estimates have been prepared to comply with the Local Government Act of Western Australia 1995 and the Local Government (Finacial Management) Regulations 1996. In accordance with those legislative requirements, forms and content the budget statements have been prepared to meet the requirements of the applicable Australian Accounting Standards and the Statements of Accounting Concepts. They have been prepared on the accrual basis under the convention of historical cost accounting.

(b) The Local Government Reporting Entity

For the purposes of reporting the City of Albany as a single unit all transactions and balances in respect to the Municipal,Loan,Trust and Reserve Funds have been consolidated.

(c) Non Current Assets

(i) Valuations of Non Current Assets

Acquisition of assets in these statements are capitalised in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards. As from 1 July 1998 all outlays on the creation of infrastructure assets will be recorded as the acquisition of non current assets. It is proposed that all infrastructure assets created in prior years will be brought to account by 30 June 2001.

(ii) Revaluations of Non Current Assets

The budget statements do not reflect any revaluation of non current assets in the accounts presented. Infrastructure assets capitalised from 1 July 1998 will be revalued in conjunction with all existing infrastructure assets to be brought to account by 30 June 2001.

(iii) Depreciation of Non Current Assets

All non current assets are depreciated over their useful life in a manner that reflects the consumption of the service potential of those assets.

Depreciation on each asset will be charged to the programme to which the asset principally relates or, where possible, to the activity the asset was used.

Depreciation is included in expense calculations when assessing service charges to be imposed but has been excluded from calculations when determining the amount of rates to be levied

(iv) Infrastructure Assets

All infrastructure assets of the City of Albany are recognised in the Statement of Financial Position in accordance with AAS27 Financial Reporting by Local Governments and the Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996.

(d) Non Cuttent Assets - Investments

Local Government House Unit Trust

During the financial year ended 30 June 1998 the above asset class was revalued. The valuation has been provided by the trustees of Local Government House. The valuation is based on the value of equity held in the Local Government House Unit Trust. There is not a policy of regular revaluation.

(c) Capitalisation of Fixed Assets - Materiality Level

The materiality threshold for the capitalisation of fixed assets is \$1000.

(f) Grants, Donations and Other Contributions

All grants, donations and other contributions have been recognised as revenues. Conditional grants received in advance are recorded as income and brought to account upon the performance of the obligations of the grant.

(g) Investments

All investments are valued at cost and interest on those investments is recognised when accrued

(h) Provision for Employee Entitlements

The estimates for employee entitlements relates to amounts expected to be paid to employees for long service leave, annual leave and sick leave and based on legal and contractual entitlements and assessment having regard to experience of staff departures and leave utilisation. Current wage rates are used in the calculation of the provisions. Long service leave is accrued on the basis of the number of years employed (continuously) in Local Government.

(i) Superannuation Funds

The City of Albany contributes to the W.A. Local Government Superannuation Scheme at the rate of 2% as a minimum statutory contribution and 8% to the National (Compulsory) Superannuation Scheme.

(j) Stock on Hand

Stock and materials are recorded at cost including taxes, freight and cartage

(k) Cash

For the purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, cash is considered to include cash on hand and in banks, cash floats and investments.

(l) Comparative Information

Comparative figures are, where appropriate, reclassified so as to be comparable with the figures presented for the budgeted financial year.

(in) Changes in Accounting Policy

The accounting policies adopted are consistant with those of the former Shire and Town.

(n) Bad and Doubtful Debts

The budget does not make any provision for uncollectable rate debtors as these are secured by a charge over a ratepayer's property. It is expected that some small bad and doubtful debts will be uncollectable during the year and the City will write these off.

(o) Rounding

All monies have been rounded to the nearest dollar and some minor variations between the supporting information and statements may result.

Discounts, Incentives and Concessions,

The Roadworks program will be funded over a longer period (15- 20 years) with the first five years being an interest only loan. Interest has been estimated at 7.00% per annum. The loan borrowing program included in the 2001/02 budget estimates have been adopted to receive and expend all the loan funds within the current year.

Loan numbers 143 and 145 are due for interest renegotiation with Bankwest during the 2001-2002 financial year. The budget estimates for these loans have been calculated using the original loan debenture interest rates as set out the Loan liability schedule. Parks & Reserves

Councils annual plant beds in and around the CBD area are renowned for the splashes of colour they provide to the streetscape.

At this current time, the beds are being prepared for the winter/spring flowering. Last season's plants have been removed, the soil enriched with organic material and then rested prior to planting in mid April.

Approx 10,500 seedlings are scheduled to be planted, with some spares to be potted up as reserves for the usual season disasters. These 'disasters' take the form of aphids, thrips, mites, moulds and mildews, winter storms, rabbits and vandals. Planting, fertilizing and finishing off the beds take about 2 weeks to complete.

This seasons planting includes : stocks, pansies, poppies, nemesias, primulas, ranunculus and kale.





Thank-you for providing the Water and Rivers Commission with the opportunity to comment on the proposal.

Waterways Protection

The Commission would support protection of the existing creekline, which occurs alongside the northern end of the unconstructed Morgan Road through a POS reserve. The subject land's creekline flows into Willyung Creek across Albany Highway, which feeds into King River and Oyster Harbour and which is protected within a foreshore reserve.

Road Alignment

The present alignment of the proposed Morgan Road shown on the Subdivision Guide Plan is a concern given that the proposed road's location would be located between the existing creek and the reserve. It is not recognised how the reserve would provide value as a buffer for the waterway if the reserve is separated from the creek by a road.

The Commission would recommend the alignment of the road be reconsidered so that the reserve is located adjacent to the creek. The road should preferably demarcate the reserve and creek's buffer from the development area. The 20m buffer zone recommended within the Amendment for drainage protection purposes is supported by the Commission.

Revegetation of the reserve should be applied as a provision of the Amendment to enhance it's function as a drainage buffer.

Nutrient and Drainage Management

The potential for nutrient export to Willyung Creek which is fed by the creekline needs to be minimised. Generally, provisions should be made for future urban areas to ensure that the quantity of stormwater is reduced and the quality of stormwater run-off from future urban areas is improved. The Commission therefore recommends that drainage management within the proposal take into account the best management practices outlined in the Water Sensitive Urban Design Guidelines.

1.0 INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this report is to request consideration be given to rezoning Lot 14 Campbell Road, Mira Mar so that it can be used for a wider range of commercial uses than is currently permissible under the existing Residential zoning.

The following report provides background information in support of the rezoning request.

2.0 LOCATION

Lot 14 is located on the eastern side of Campbell Road approximately 170 metres north of the Campbel Road/Middleton Road intersection. Figure 1 refers.

3.0 ZONING, AREA & SURROUNDING LANDUSE


Lot 14 is currently zoned "Residentia!" under the provisions of Council's Town Planning Scheme No. 1A. The property is 764m² in area and has been developed with a single residential dwelling and associated outbuildings.


Apart from a strip of land reserved Parks & Recreation, land to the north of the subject land is zoned "Industry" and has been developed as the Kingsley Place commercial area. The strip of Parks & Recreation land has been incorporated into a plant nursery which forms part of this commercial area.

Lot 13 immediately to the south is zoned "Residential" but has been developed as a car park for the ambulance depot which is located on the adjoining Lots 11 & 12. These two lots are zoned "Clubs & Institutions". Land to the east is zoned "Residential" and on the western side of Campbell Road, the land immediately opposite is zoned "Residential" and has been developed with residential units. To the north of these units land is zoned "Other Commercial" and to the south is a service station.

4.0 SERVICE INFRASTRUCTURE

All major services such as reticulated water and sewer, sealed road, power and telecommunications are available to service the site.

5.0 PLANNING CONTEXT

The Albany Commercial Centres Strategy to the years 2001 & 2021 (1994) and the review of this Strategy carried out in 2000 are the main planning documents relating to commercial development.

With regard to office development, the Strategy recommends any office development over 200m² should be located within a major centre, but all office developments should be considered on merit. Impact statements should be requested for specialised centres for developments over 200m² NLA.

6.0 PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT

As acknowledged in a letter to the previous owner of the subject land, (refer Attachment 1) rezoning of the property is not considered an unreasonable proposition given that the majority of lots fronting Campbell Road in this locality are used for non-residential activities.

Given the size of the lot, 764m², rezoning to the "Industry" or "Other Commercial" zone is not considered a practical solution. A site of this size is unlikely to cater for most industrial/commercial uses and their associated car parking, unloading bays and manoeuvring areas. Potential impacts on adjoining residential land to the rear also needs to be taken into consideration.

Rezoning as a Special Site to permit professional offices is suggested as being more appropriate for this site. Such uses would be able to utilise and refurbish the existing residence. Floorspace is unlikely to exceed 200m² NLA, consequently any impacts on existing commercial centres will be negligible. Car parking can be accommodated but may entail removal of outbuildings.

7.0 CONCLUSION

Subject to Council agreement in principle to rezoning Lot 14 Campbell Road, detailed rezoning documentation can be prepared in support of the proposal to permit the property to be used for professional offices. Such uses are considered appropriate for the site given the location and size of the lot.

I have also discussed this matter with the City's Executive Director Development Services, Mr Robert Fenn, and it would appear that the rezoning of your land would not be an unreasonable proposition, given that the majority of lots fronting Campbell Road are currently being used for non-residential activities. Neither Mr Fenn nor myself can at this point give you an assurance that your land would be rezoned, as that decision ultimately rests with the Minister for Planning and the 14 Councillors who make up the Council of the City of Albany. An application for rezoning would need to be lodged with the City of Albany and the rezoning process will take approximately 9-12 months to complete; you will also incur a Council fee of \$1,500 and be required to engage a qualified planning consultant to prepare the necessary amending documents.

As I understand from our discussion, you will shortly be moving away from Albany and your property is on the market. I regret to advise that Council cannot give you a guarantee that a rezoning would be successful. Therefore, any person seeking to buy your land on the assumption that it has a higher and better use, should do so at their risk.

You may also be unaware that under the existing "Residential" zoning, it is possible for the following land uses to be developed on your property with special Council approval:

GUIDED DEVELOPMENT SCHEME NO. 12

The City of Albany under the powers conferred by the Town Planning and Development Act 1928 makes the following Development Scheme.

Part 1 – Preliminary

1.0 Citation

The City of Albany Guided Development Scheme No. 12 ("the Scheme") comes into operation on its Gazettal date.

1.1 Scheme Title

The Scheme is titled Guided Development Scheme Bayonet Head ODP Area.

1.2 Responsible Authority

The responsible authority for enforcing the observance of the Scheme shall be the City of Albany (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").

1.3 Scheme Area

The Scheme Area shall apply to the land contained within the inner edge of the broken black line shown on the Scheme Area Map (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme Area") as Appendix One.

1.4 Contents of the Scheme

The Scheme comprises:

- (a) the Scheme Text;
- (b) the Scheme Map.

The Bayonet Head Outline Development Plan (hereinafter referred to as the Scheme Map) forms part of the Scheme as Appendix Two. The Scheme Map is intended to function as an indicative outline of proposed land uses and including the adopted designed layout within the Scheme Area and is to form the basis of development and subdivision within the Scheme Area.

1.5 Object of the Scheme

The object of the Scheme is to define and make provision for the equitable apportionment of the cost of specific infrastructure items and works that collectively benefit the Owners.

1.6 Schedules and Appendices

Any Schedule or Appendix appended to this Scheme Text forms part of the Scheme.

1.7 Headings

The Table of Contents and the heading of any clause or subclause are intended for reference purposes only and do not affect the construction of the Scheme.

1.8 Purposes of the Scheme

For the purpose of achieving orderly and proper planning within the Scheme Area and

including the equitable sharing of the cost of essential infrastructure items and works, the purposes of the Scheme are:

- 1.8.1 To allow the Owners to proceed with the subdivision and development of their land as and when they choose in accordance with the outline contained in the Scheme Map.
- **1.8.2** To coordinate and facilitate the progressive implementation of subdivision and development within the Scheme Area in accordance with the adopted Scheme Map.
- 1.8.3 To make provision for the setting aside of land required for public open space and community purpose, Main drainage, detention basins and a landscape buffer abutting the Lower King Road.
- **1.8.4** To make provision for determination of the value of the land required for the purposes outlined in subclause 1.8.3.
- 1.8.5 To make provision for the proper drainage of the Scheme Area and including the installation of Main drainage, and detention basins as specified in the BHFMPR and minor landscape works relative to the detention basins as detailed therein.
- **1.8.6** To provide for the upgrading of Lower King road to a dual carriageway incorporating associated roundabout, drainage and footpath works.
- **1.8.7** To provide for the landscaping of the 10 metre wide buffer strip abutting Lower King Road.
- **1.8.8** To make provision for the respective rights and obligations of the Owners and the Council.
- 1.8.9 To improve and secure a desirable amenity for the Scheme Area.
- 1.8.10 To make provision for the equitable apportionment of the Shared Costs between the Owners including the allocation and recoupment of all administration, interest (if any) and other costs deemed applicable thereto.
- **1.8.11** To make provision for the Administration and Management of the Scheme, collection of the Shared Costs and the annual review of those costs.
- **1.8.12** To make provision for any other matters which are necessary or incidental to town planning and the development of the Scheme Area.

1.9 The Aims of the Scheme

The aims of the Scheme are to:

- (a) facilitate the development of the Scheme Area into a properly and comprehensively planned urban estate; and
- (b) provide a mechanism whereby the local government can recover contributions to the provisions of specific infrastructure items and works from the Owners in the Scheme

Area on an equitable basis; and

(c) following collection of the contributions referred in (b) above, to then allocate such contributions to and between the Owners according to their respective entitlement pursuant to the provisions of the Scheme.

1.10 Definitions

- 1.10.1 Unless the context otherwise requires, words and expressions used in the Scheme have the same meaning as they have
 - (a) in the Town Planning Act; or
 - (b) if they are not defined in that Act -
 - (i) in the Dictionary of defined words and expressions in Schedule One; or
 - (ii) in the District Zoning Scheme

1.11 Relationship with other Schemes and laws

Where a provision of the Scheme is inconsistent with:

- (a) the District Zoning Scheme; or
- (b) a local law,

the provision of the Scheme prevails.

1.12 Term of the Scheme

The Scheme comes into force on its Gazettal date and continues in operation until it is revoked by the appointed Minister of the Crown.

Part 2 - Infrastructure

2.1 Infrastructure

The following infrastructure is to be provided in the Scheme Area;

- (a) the provision of main drainage throughout those parts of the Scheme Area which require main drainage including the construction of detention basins or other similar works associated with main drainage as detailed on the Bayonet Head Flood Management Plan (Figure 5) attached as Appendix Three:
- (b) the provision of landscaping surrounding and relative to the detention basins;
- (c) the upgrading of Lower King Road to a dual carriageway including all associated works such as roundabout, drainage and footpaths;
- (d) the provision of land for local open space, community purpose, conservation, drainage and a 10 metre wide landscape buffer abutting Lower King Road.

- (e) as and when the Owners subdivide their land such subdivision shall be carried out in accordance with the conditional subdivisional approval issued by the Department for Planning and Infrastructure which amongst other provisions may include a requirement for the carrying out of the specific infrastructure items/works referred in (a-d) above.
- (f) the land identified on the Scheme Map as being required for a primary school, is to be acquired by the Education Department.

2.2 Subdivision and Development

- 2.2.1 Subdivision and development in the Scheme Area is to be generally in accordance with the design layout depicted on the Scheme Map.
- **2.2.2** The location of infrastructure associated with such subdivision and development is to be generally in accordance with the Scheme Map.

2.3 Funding Infrastructure Items and Works

- **2.3.1** The Council may if it so chooses, fund the provision of any infrastructure items and or works by:
 - (a) using any funds properly available to the Council for this purpose; or
 - (b) subject to obtaining the written consent of at least 55% of the Owners, borrowing the appropriate amount.
- 2.3.2 If the Council elects to borrow monies for the purposes referred in clause 2.3.1 hereof, all capital, interest charges and costs incurred by the Council in undertaking such borrowing, shall be recoverable form the Owners as a Shared Cost.
- 2.3.3 An Owner may with the agreement of Council, fund the provision of any infrastructure items and or works and be reimbursed by the Council for any amount in excess of the Owner's cost contribution under the Scheme.
- **2.3.4** The Council may reimburse an Owner as referred in clause 2.3.3 either by applying funds available under clause 2.3.1 or from cost contributions paid under the Scheme.
- 2.3.5 The Council shall be under no obligation to pay to or reimburse an Owner monies entitled to be paid to them under the Scheme until such time as the Council has received sufficient monies from the Owners required to make payment to the Council, to enable the payment to be made.

2.4 Powers of the Council

- **2.4.1** The Council has power to carry out all works and do all things necessary or desirable for the purpose of implementing the Scheme.
- **2.4.2** Without limiting clause 2.4.1 the Council may:

- (a) enter into an agreement with any Owner, occupier or other person having an interest in land affected by the provisions of the Scheme in respect of any matter pertaining to the Scheme;
- (b) consult with or enter into an agreement with any public authority in respect of any matter pertaining to the Scheme;
- (c) acquire any land or buildings within the Scheme Area under the provisions of the Scheme or the Act;
- (d) deal with or dispose of any land it has acquired under the provisions of the Scheme or the Act in accordance with the law and for such purpose may make such agreements with other Owners as it considers fit; and
- (e) carry out such works outside the Scheme Area as are reasonably required for the purpose of implementing the Scheme.
- **2.4.3** A person authorised by the Council may at all reasonable times and with such assistance as may be required, enter any building or land for the purposes of:
 - (a) ascertaining whether the provisions of the Scheme are being observed; and
 - (b) for any other matter pertaining to implementing the Scheme.

2.5 Appointment of Scheme Manager

- 2.5.1 The Council may appoint as Scheme Manager a person or Company with appropriate expertise and experience in financial management and land development, on such terms and conditions considered appropriate by the Council.
- 2.5.2 The Scheme Manager is responsible for carrying out such works and doing such things to implement the Scheme as are authorised by the Council.

2.6 Infrastructure Costs

The infrastructure costs are:

- (a) all costs of and incidental to providing the infrastructure referred in clause 2.1, including any works carried out outside the Scheme Area in accordance with clause 2.4.2 (e);
- (b) the costs of and incidental to the preparation of the Scheme;
- (c) the administration costs of the Scheme, including fees for a Scheme manager, planners, engineers and other professional consultants, and valuation costs;
- (d) interest on monies borrowed for the purposes of the Scheme;

- (e) bank charges, taxes or other costs incurred in connection with the borrowing of moneys;
- (f) the cost of, and incidental to, the acquisition of any land required for the purposes of the Scheme, either compulsorily or by agreement;
- (g) the costs of, and incidental to, carrying out surveys or calculations for the purposes of determining cost contributions; and
- (h) any goods and services tax incurred in the implementation of the Scheme.

Part 3 - Cost Contributions

3.1 Apportionment of Infrastructure Costs

Infrastructure costs are to be apportioned between the Owners according to the percentage that the area of the Owner's land bears to the total of all the Owners land within the Scheme Area having regard to the excluded land referred in clause 3.6

3.2 The Owners Percentage

The Owner's land and applicable percentage is as detailed in Schedule Two attached.

3.3 Cost Apportionment Schedule

Apportionment of the costs is as detailed in Schedule Three attached.

3.4 Cost Contributions Based on Estimates

- 3.4.1 The value of the Infrastructure costs is to be based on amounts expended, but when an expenditure has not occurred, it is to be based on the best and latest estimated costs available to the Council.
- 3.4.2 Where a cost apportionment schedule contains estimated costs, such estimated costs are to be reviewed annually in the month of June by the Council.
 - (a) in the case of land to be acquired, in accordance with clause 3.5.2; and
 - (b) in all other cases, in accordance with the best and latest information available to the Council, until the expenditure on the relevant item of infrastructure has occurred.
- 3.4.3 The Council is to have such estimated costs independently certified by an appropriately qualified person and must provide such independent certification to an Owner when requested to do so.
- 3.4.4 Where any cost contribution has been calculated on the basis of an estimated cost and remains unpaid at the time of the annual review, the Council:
 - (i) is to adjust the cost contribution of the Owner in accordance with the revised estimated costs; and

- may accept a cost contribution, based upon estimated costs, as a final cost (ii) contribution and enter into an agreement with the Owner accordingly.
- 3.4.5 Where the Owner's cost contribution is adjusted under clause 3.4.4, the Council, on receiving a request in writing from the Owner, is to provide the Owner with a copy of the estimated costs and the calculation of adjustments.

3.5 Valuation

3.5.1 Clause 3.5 applies in order to determine the value of land to be acquired for the purpose of providing infrastructure.

3.5.2 In Clause 3.5:

In respect of land required for public open space, community purpose site plus the elevated portion of Pt. Lot 1 Alison Parade as determined by the Valuer that is required for drainage and the landscape buffer abutting Lower King Road:

'Value' means fair nett expectance value which is to be calculated by determining the highest and best use of the land either on its own or with other land considered ripe for subdivision in its optimum form after allowance for all usual costs and expenses attributed to that land required to carry out such an exercise and including an allowance for profit and risk as deemed by the Valuer to be applicable in the area.

In respect of land required for main drainage

'Value' means the currently deemed value of the land having regard to the fact that such land has limited if any development potential.

'Valuer' means a licensed valuer agreed by the Council and the Owner, or where the Council and the Owner are unable to reach agreement, a valuer appointed by the President of the Western Australian Division of the Australian Property Institute.

- 3.5.3 If the Owner objects to a valuation made by the valuer, the Owner may give notice to the Council requesting a review of the amount of the value at the Owner's expense, within 28 days after being informed of the value.
- If the valuer does not change the value of the land to a figure acceptable to the 3.5.4 Owner, the value is to be determined:
 - (a) by any method agreed between the Council and the Owner; or
 - if the Council and the Owner cannot agree, by arbitration in accordance with (b) the Commercial Arbitration Act 1985.

3.6 Excluded Land

For the purposes of clause 3.1, in calculating both the area of the Owner's land, and the total area of land in the Scheme Area, the area of land provided in the Scheme Area for:

(a) existing dedicated roads;

- (b) public open space and community purpose site;
- (c) land required for conservation and drainage; and
- (d) land required for a Foreshore Reserve.

is deemed excluded land.

3.7 Liability for Cost Contributions

- 3.7.1 An Owner is required to make a cost contribution in accordance with the Scheme.
- 3.7.2 An Owner's liability to pay the Owner's cost contribution to the Council arises immediately prior to the earlier of:
 - (a) the Commission endorsing its approval on the Plan of Survey of the subdivision of the Owner's land within the Scheme Area;
 - the commencement of any development on the Owner's land within the Scheme Area;
 - (c) the time of applying to the Council or Commission for approval of any development on the Owner's land within the Scheme Area; or
 - (d) the expiry of the Scheme, as determined by the Council.

3.8 Payment of Cost Contributions

- **3.8.1** The Owner, with the agreement of the Council, is to pay the Owner's cost contribution by:
 - (a) cheque or cash;
 - (b) transferring to the Council or a public authority land in satisfaction of the cost contribution.
 - (c) some other method acceptable to the Council; or
 - (d) any combination of these methods.
- 3.8.2 The Owner, with the agreement of the Council, may pay the Owner's cost contribution in a lump sum, by instalments or in such other manner acceptable to the Council.
- 3.8.3 Payment by an Owner of the cost contribution, including a cost contribution based upon estimated costs, constitutes full and final discharge of the Owner's liability under the Scheme.

3.9 Charge on Land

- 3.9.1 The amount of any cost contribution for which an Owner is liable under clause 3.7, but has not paid, is a charge on the Owner's land to which the cost contribution relates, and the Council may lodge a caveat, at the Owner's expense, against the Owner's title to that land.
- 3.9.2 The Council, at the Owner's expense and subject to such other conditions as the Council thinks fit, is to withdraw a caveat lodged under clause 3.9.1 to permit a dealing and may then re-lodge the caveat to prevent further dealings.
- 3.9.3 At the time the cost contribution is paid in full, and if requested to do so by the Owner, the Council at the expense of the Owner, is to withdraw any caveat lodged under clause 3.9.

Part 4 - Management of Cost Contributions

4.1 Administration of Funds

- 4.1.1 The Council is to establish and maintain a reserve account in accordance with the Local Government Act 1995 for the purposes of the Scheme into which cost contributions for the Scheme Area will be credited and from which all payments for infrastructure costs will be paid. The purpose of such a reserve account or the use of money in such a reserve account is limited to the application of funds for the purpose for which the funds were paid under the Scheme.
- 4.1.2 Interest earned on cost contributions credited to a reserve account in accordance with clause 4.1.1 is to be applied in the Scheme Area.
- 4.1.3 The Council is to provide to an Owner who has a liability to make a cost contribution an audited annual statement of accounts for the Scheme Area as soon as practicable after the audited annual statement of accounts becomes available when requested to do so by an Owner.

4.2 Shortfall or Excess in Cost Contributions

- 4.2.1 If there is a shortfall in the total of cost contributions when all cost contributions have been made or accounted for, the Council may:
 - (a) make good the shortfall from its municipal fund;
 - (b) enter into agreements with Owners to fund the shortfall; or
 - (c) raise loans or borrow from a financial institution.

but nothing in paragraph 4.2.1 (a) restricts the right or power of the Council to impose a Special Area rate over the Scheme Area in that regard,

4.2.2 If there is an excess in funds available to the Scheme Area when all expenditure has

been made or funds accounted for within the Scheme Area, the Council shall apply the excess funds for the provision of additional facilities or improvements within the Scheme Area.

Part 5 - Administration

5.1 Compensation

The time within which a person may make a claim for compensation pursuant to Section 11 of the Act is 6 months after the date when notice of the approval of the Scheme is published in the Government Gazette.

5.2 Arbitration

With exception to any appeal relating to a Planning decision and subject to clause 3.5.4, if any dispute or difference arises between the Council and an Owner in regard to any matter related to the implementation of the Scheme, or arising out of the application or interpretation of any provision of the Scheme Text, that dispute or difference may be referred for determination by a single arbitrator in accordance with the provisions of the Commercial Arbitration Act 1985, unless the parties agree on some other method of determination.

Each party shall bear its own costs of the arbitration unless the arbitrator determines that the costs have been caused or contributed to by the unreasonable, frivolous or vexatious actions of one party or the other, in which case the arbitrator may make an award as to the payment of costs by and to one party or the other.

5.3 Appeals

5.3.1 An Owner within the Scheme Area aggrieved by a decision of the Council in respect of the exercise of a discretionary power, may appeal in accordance with Part V of the Act. Such a decision must be a decision which relates to land in the Scheme Area owned by the Owner at the time the decision was made. If the Owner commences an appeal under this clause, the commencement of an appeal precludes the right to refer the matter to arbitration in accordance with the provisions of the preceding clause.

5.4 Acquisition and Sale

Under this Scheme the Council may exercise the powers of acquisition contained in Section 13 of the Act and the powers to deal with any land so acquired as provided in Section 14 of the Act.

SCHEDULE ONE

Dictionary of Defined Words and Expressions

In this Scheme -

'Act'

means the Town Planning and Development Act 1928.

'An Owner' or 'The Owners'

means in relation to the subdivision of the land referred in Schedule Two, includes the Crown and every person who jointly or severally whether at law or in equity:

- (a) is entitled to the land for an estate in fee simple in possession;
- (b) is a person to whom the Crown has lawfully contracted to grant the fee simple of that land;
- (c) is a lessor or licensee from the Crown; or
- (d) is entitled to receive or is in receipt of, or if the land were let to a tenant, would be entitled to receive, the rents and profits from that land, whether as beneficial owner, trustee, mortgagee in possession or otherwise.

'Commission'

means the Western Australian Planning Commission.

'Cost Apportionment Schedule'

means Schedule Three attached as referred in clause 3.3.

'Cost Contribution'

means the contribution to Infrastructure Costs payable by an Owner under the Scheme as detailed in Schedule Three.

'Department for Planning and Infrastructure'

means the Department for Planning and Infrastructure as established by the Government or its successor as the case may be

'Development'

has the meaning given to the term on Section 2 of the Act.

'Development Cost'

means all costs required to create a new residential lot in accordance with normal conditions imposed on such development by the Department for Planning and

Infrastructure.

'District Zoning Scheme'

means the City of Albany Town Planning

Scheme No. 3 or its successor.

'Gazettal Date'

in relation to the Scheme, means the date on which the Scheme is published in the

Gazette under section 7(3) of the Act.

'Infrastructure'

means the infrastructure referred in clause

2.1.

'Infrastructure Costs'

means the infrastructure costs referred in

clause 2.6.

'Main Drainage'

means the provision of drainage to accord with the Bayonet Head Flood Management Plan (Figure 5) attached as Appendix Three and the Bayonet Head Flood Management Plan Report (BHFMPR) as undertaken and compiled by PPK Environment and Infrastructure Pty Ltd dated March 2000.

'Manager'

means the person or persons whether corporate or otherwise appointed by the Council to perform the functions of the Council as set out in the Scheme as authorised by the Council.

'Nett Realisation'

means the realisable value of the lots that can be created on land required for an Infrastructure purpose after deducting all directly associated development costs as determined by the Valuer.

'Owners Land'

means the Owner of land, as defined in the definition of 'An Owner' or 'The Owner' referred to above subject to the provisions of clauses 3.1 and 3.6.

'Shared Costs'

means the Infrastructure costs referred in

clause 2.6.

'Valuer'

has the meaning referred in clause 3.5.2





2.0 MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

MOVED CR EVERS SECONDED MRS STANTON

THAT the minutes of the Local Planning Strategy Steering Committee held on the 21" February 2002, be confirmed as a true and accurate record of the meeting.

CARRIED

3.0 OPEN FORUM

Mr Perry Stanbrook, owner of a fish processing factory located on Kitson Road, spoke on behalf of a group of residents who own businesses in or around Kitson Road, Roundhay Road and Balston Road. He referred to Item 6.0, A4 of the previous meeting where the committee agreed to recommend this area be rezoned Rural/Special Rural and requested further information on the implications of this recommendation.

Mr Fenn explained the purpose of the recommendation to change the land usage from light industrial to rural/special rural was to reinforce Council's desire to locate industry to more compatible, long term industrial areas. He explained that those existing businesses that wished to remain in the area were able to do so under existing ownership rights and they would be entitled to make application to expand their businesses providing they met normal Council requirements. However, the area in question is bounded by residential zoning and has a number of other, long term issues, such as accessibility and the low lying nature of the land, which makes it less than desirable for industrial purposes.

Mr Fenn also outlined the role of the ALPS as a strategic document and the expected time frames for the creation of the new Town Planning Scheme.

Mr Peter Bassett, owner of an engineering business on Roundhay Road advised the committee he has intentions to expand his business in the future. Mr Rob Lucas expressed similar concerns over land he owned in the area but had not yet developed.

The Chairman thanked those in the gallery for their input. In total there are about 6 or 7 existing businesses that would be affected by the change in land usage. Committee members felt that, given the above and the fact that if the land was proposed to be rezoned to rural/special rural the land would most likely attract a higher return in the future.

5.0 REPORT ON PROGRESS OF STUDIES ALIGNED TO ALBANY LOCAL PLANNING STRATEGY (ALPS)

5.1 CITY OF ALBANY GREENWAYS PLAN

Melanie Price, Environmental Planning Officer for the City of Albany, addressed the committee on the history of the Greenways Plan, through community consultation and workshops and how the outcomes of the Plan are intended to be incorporated in the ALPS review and eventually the new TPS.

Melanie explained that Greenways are defined as "networks of corridors that are planned, designed and managed for multiple purposes including ecological, recreational, cultural, aesthetic or other purposes compatible with sustainable land uses". The Greenways Plan provides information on where existing vegetation and access networks are located (reserves, roadways and trails) and also identifies areas than can be set aside to provide connections such as natural vegetation areas and creek ways. The study covered both public and private land.

Three types of greenways were identified, being ecological (conservation of fauna, flora and water protection), recreational (which could also incorporate conservation values such as the Bibbleman Track and other trails) and utilitarian (major roads and street scapes and other transport routes). Emphasis in the Plan has been on the protection and enhancement of natural values and providing visual attractions, particularly along entrance roads to Albany.

Marisa Papalia added that the key to successful integration of the Greenways Plan into both ALPS and subsequently the new TPS, would be in the implementation process. Planning mechanisms need to be formulated to encourage the establishment of these links, particularly where private land was identified or new sub-divisions were proposed. A number of different methods have been identified and are being developed such as education, awareness and greater community involvement as well as incentives either financial (rating rebates) or in kind (such as fencing etc). Memorials are also an option however administration of these may prove too burdensome. Provisions could also be included in the new TPS to encourage flexibility and support the necessary policy changes.

5.2 LOWER GREAT SOUTHERN REGION STRATEGY

Mr Woodward reported that a third technical committee meeting had been held recently, and working groups will be drafting position papers until the middle of May. A draft report is anticipated towards the end of the year. Mr Fenn added that detailed position papers on transport and environmental water resources are close to finalisation. This information is being linked through informal methods however briefings on specific matters, such as the Department of Transport's traffic study of Albany, will be provided to the Committee.

5.3 RURAL PLANNING ISSUES REVIEW

Marisa Papalia advised that findings from two workshops held earlier this year have been collated and forwarded to the consultant (Peter Driscoll) for summary; copies will be forwarded to the attendees early next week. Initial results from the Rural Issues paper clearly identifies two distinct areas of expectation and they are segregated geographically east and west. She added that the public response had been excellent and far exceeded expectations.

The State Planning Policy on rural land use was released last week and it was suggested that a briefing could be organised to include Councillors. Mr Woodward undertook to arrange for copies to be made available.

5.4 SPECIAL CHARACTER AREA STUDY

5.5 CBD STUDY

No further report.

5.6 WAPC/CITY OF ALBANY TRAFFIC MODELLING

Mr Woodward advised that additional funding from the Department of Transport has been sourced to assist with this study.

6.0 CONSIDERATION OF SUBMISSIONS

The Executive Director Development Services provided at the last meeting, a grouped summary of the issues raised in the first 100 submissions to assist the committee to work through the submissions. The following was resolved:

A4 Following the presentation made by community representatives regarding Kitson Road, the committee agreed that their original recommendation to Council remain unchanged..

C. URBAN GROWTH

C8. Contain urban growth to cleared land.

In principal, where cleared land can be used for urban growth it should be encouraged, but cannot be restricted at the expense of proper and orderly development.

Developers should be required to assess vegetation removal when rezoning for development and include land capability as well as structure plans to ensure good planning is taken into account (ie management of vegetation, run off of nutrients, etc).

C9. Urban encroachment on sewer plants and other conflicting land uses

To be considered with other residential buffering issues such as mapping for noise impacts of the speedway. Mr Juers undertook to provided Water Corporation information on buffer zone modelling for the Timewell Road site.

C10. Pines Estate to Residential

Rezoned to residential with R2 or R2.5 density coding on existing block size considered desirable.

C11. Chivers and others to Special Rural

Deferred to next meeting – will be included in Peter Driscoll's review and also a broader look at the implications of the City's Local Rural Strategy needs to be undertaken.

C12. CSBP site for tourist use

Should not be earmarked for industrial in long term but tourist residential usage may be also inappropriate — need to allow for a number of options (excluding industry) for long term use should CSBP vacate the site.

C13. Gas Works site shown as conservation

Remain as conservation zoning. Liase with Landcorp for longer term use.

C14. Building beight restrictions

Include reference in text, particularly regarding slopes of Mounts Clarence and Melville but include more detail within the TPS process.

C15. Conservation classification

Include clarification in legend of definitions for conservation, environmental protection and recreational reserve zoning. Review scale of drawings details.

C16. Rural areas constraining urban expansion

Once plans and text are amended to show a "20 year" plan, reflecting a more realistic growth rate, areas currently identified as rural may be suitable for interim subdivision or quasi-rural development provided they are identified in Strategy for future urban use.

C17. Bayonet Head/Lower King expansion

Already zoned.

7.0 GENERAL BUSINESS

Mrs K Stanton, Cr M Bojcun and Mr K Shanhan indicated their desire to be nominated for the Rural Reference Working Group.

W.9 PROCESS OF APPROVAL - PROVISION OF CAUSEWAY - PRAWN ROCK CHANNEL

The purpose of the causeway is to facilitate vehicular access to the eastern end of Ocean Beach during the period when the sand bar is closed.

- (1) Council, through the Manager, Engineering Services, apply annually, in writing to WIMA, for approval to construct the causeway.
- (2) WIMA makes a decision on the causeway based on environmental grounds.
- (3) Council is responsible to construct and remove the causeway in accordance with conditions set by WIMA.
- (4) Council retains the right not to proceed with the construction if approval conditions set are too severe.
- (5) Council/WIMA are jointly responsible for determining signage location and type.
- (6) WIMA is the primary contact agency with regard to communication on environmental impacts of the causeway.
- (7) Council is the primary contact agency with regard to initiating the causeway and impacts of the causeway other than environmental.

9.0 PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION STUDIES

Mr Martin Baird, Project Manager from the Department for Planning and Infrastructure tabled a draft concept plan for the proposed boat harbour that had been developed in-house by the Department and was based on their internal knowledge and the land uses identified in previous Council resolutions. Features of the concept plan include:-

- A deep water wharf (breakwater) with deep water moorings
- Commercial and recreational pens
- Dredging requirements
- Relocated boat trailer parking and ramp
- Boat yard and hardstand
- Commercial land
- Boat harbour buildings and boardwalk
- Landscaping areas
- Carparks
- Recreational buildings

It was emphasised that the concept plan was only a starting point for further development and dialogue with stakeholders and the wider community. It was agreed that the capital cost of the works required would not provide a positive return on investment for the State and capital funding would need to be provided as a public infrastructure development for Albany.

A key element of the initial concept plan is community access and use through the provision of boardwalks and public areas such as a beach. Issues requiring further work include impact on seagrass, capital cost of alignments, pedestrian and vehicle transport access; stormwater drainage management, contaminates in soil profile, demand for land identified as commercial use, vista from York Street and flushing of the harbour.

Martin Baird offered the assistance of the Department to further develop the concept plan before it is made available for further stakeholder and public comment.

Robert Fenn suggested the alignment may have some impact on seagrass meadows and that stormwater flows would need to be addressed. Further stakeholder consultation will be required with relevant agencies and Council. He also suggested the proposed land development would require detailed planning assessment including cost estimates. A structure plan over land areas would be required as part of the detailed implementation studies.

The Chairman thanked DPI for its assistance in developing the preliminary concept plan.

10.0 FINANCING THE DETAILED STUDIES

The Executive officer advised that the City of Albany has received advice from the GSDC regarding the requested \$150,000 State Government funding for the detailed planning studies. It is likely funding of \$90,000 will be made available from DPI and an amount of \$60,000 will need to be applied for from the GSDC's Regional Development Scheme in November 2002. The remaining funding to make up the \$270,000 is being sourced from the Regional Assistance Program of

the Department of Transport and Regional Services (\$70,000). The outcomes of this application will be known in early April 2002. Jon Berry reported he and Andrew Hammond are meeting with the Federal Minister for Transport and Regional Services on 28 March 2002 to outline the project and potential Commonwealth involvement. An allocation of \$50,000 from Council will also be sought in the 2002/03 budget deliberations.

It was noted that a formal response from the Minister for Planning and Infrastructure regarding the proposed level of State Government involvement in the project had not been received. Peter Watson offered to follow this up with the Minister's office.

Martin Baird reported that DPI are able to continue to assist with the concept plan on the marine aspects of the harbour and would provide input into the scope of works for additional consultancy services. He also reported DPI has a panel of consultants it uses for works such as those proposed.

Maynard Rye reported that the GSDC had submitted a Treasury Bid for the capital works of \$12m and that this is still under consideration by Treasury and relevant Ministers.
