### Councillors

I would like to summarise the most significant aspects of my attendance at the Sustainable Economic Growth for Regional Australia conference in October, which I attended as Chair of Regional Development Australia-Great Southern, and as Mayor of Albany, member of WA Regional Cities Alliance.

The first day of the conference was devoted to Building the RDA brand. Relevant issues were discussed, such as:

- How to facilitate collaboration between RDA's
- Identify and address some of the priority issues and actions for RDA's at a local level based on the implementation of their regional plans
- Provision of a wide range of perspectives on regional development
- Develop strategies that allow RDA's to consult and engage with communities to support regional planning
- Where are the big ideas for innovative regional development?

The second day began with an address by The Hon. Simon Crean, MP, Minister for Regional Australia, Regional Development and Local Government, and the Arts.

Minister Crean will be in WA in December to meet with our local RDA's.

WA Regional Cities Alliance met, and I presented an agenda item seeking support from the Alliance for the funding of Regional CBD improvements. It was supported and we are expecting in the new year to meet with Premier Barnett, and Ministers John Castrilli and Brendon Grylls.

### Other activities included:

- A visit to Queensland Nickel Refinery
- Townsville Port Authority where they export zinc, copper, nickel and magnetite. How they deal with land use conflicts being so close to the centre of Townsville
- We received a briefing from Lt Col John Hathaway of the Australian Defence Force on the Army and Airbase that contributes 10% of Townsvilles GDP

Since the October Ordinary Council Meeting, the most significant event was the visit between 10 and 14 November by guests from our Sister City Peronne, in France-Mayor Valerie Kumm and Director of Tourism Laurent Duprez, Region of Somme.

Their visit coincided with the RSL Remembrance Day Service and Mayor Kumm was honoured to lay a wreath on behalf of the citizens of Peronne.

A Civic Reception followed when we had an opportunity to perform a reciprocal signing of the Friendship Agreement which was originally signed in Peronne in November 2008, coinciding with the 90<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Armistice in France.

Another significant outcome of their visit was an opportunity to welcome Mayor Kumm as an honorary member of the Albany Anzac Centenary Alliance and to involve both our guests in the significant work and progress which has been achieved and how we can work in unison as we move towards 2014 and beyond to promote Albany as one of Australia's most important military history and tourism destinations.

In conjunction with the visit, we were fortunate to attend a Parliamentary hosted luncheon in Perth for our Peronne guests, which gave City staff and Alliance members a wonderful opportunity to promote and gain support in the political circle for the Albany Anzac Centenary programme and significant military heritage tourism product.

We were formally welcomed and acknowledged in the Legislative Council by the President, the Hon. Barry House.

I extend my thanks to the many people and organisations who contributed to make their visit a memorable one.

It was also a pleasure to host students from the John Calvin School in the Council Chamber and give them an insight into the operations of Council. Thank you to Mr Jamieson for his significant contribution to this occasion.



## ROMAN2 Presentation – delivered by Michelle MacKenzie

- Councils received a ROMAN2 information package (ROMAN is a Road Asset Management Software System).
- Councils to determine individually whether they will take up the ROMAN2 offer.
- ROMAN2 is a software system that WALGA is purchasing on behalf of the sector in partnership with Local Government and Australian Road Research Group. The presentation covered –
  - Why ROMAN2 is an important product
  - What it contains
  - How it is governed.
- Local Government owns in the vicinity of \$18b of road infrastructure in Western Australia. The data is used by Main Roads to allocate grants to regions. ROMAN2 is the basis that WALGA hopes Councils will use to allocate their funding for road grants.
- Whilst it is currently not mandatory at the moment, WALGA believes that conversations at State/Federal level will make it mandatory for Councils to have asset management planning for the future and ROMAN2 will assist with the Road Asset Management planning.
- WALGA engaged in an exhaustive tender process with ROMAN2 being considered the "best value for money" package.

- ROMAN1 has been used for the past fifteen years.
- ROMAN2 has a lot of support packages for Council staff to utilise. WALGA
  has bulk purchased the software product on behalf of all Councils.
  WALGA is confident that ROMAN2 will be up and running by Feb 2011
  and it hopes to have Councils transfer their ROMANI data into ROMAN2
  by May 2011 at the latest.
- WALGA is linking ROMAN2 to the Main Roads system "IRIS" (Integrated Road Information System).
- Basically, as mentioned previously, there is a bulk purchase of ROMAN2 by WALGA on behalf of Councils. The more Councils that participate in ROMAN2, the economies of scale decrees that it will be cheaper for each Council.
- There has been a letter mailed out to Councils inviting participation in ROMAN2. Please direct enquiries to Michelle MacKenzie.
- WALGA has a five year contract which is a rolling contract which develops as need arises
- ROMAN2 will go "live" in February 2011.
- Graham Lantzke is the ROMAN 2 project manager and he can be emailed at the following address -roman2@walga.asn.au
- Question from Cr Beeck—" who is responsible for transferring data into ROMAN2?".
   Michelle MacKenzie The function is included as part of the tender. ROMAN1 data has to be translated into ROMAN2. Jack Dowling who was at the City of Gosnells, is taking current ROMAN1. There is a software programme to cleanse the data in ROMAN1 prior to being translated to ROMAN2.
- Question from Steve Gash (Kojonup) Given the economies of scale with purchasing ROMAN2 is there a maximum cost per Council?
   Michelle MacKenzie – WALGA has based the fee structure on contacting Councils to get an indicative idea of whether they would purchase ROMAN2 or not. WALGA believes it has principal support from Local Government and now it requires the written support of Local Government.

# 6. 2011/12 Program Submissions

• Steve Hutchings advised that the State Black Spot guidelines have been reviewed and now a Road Safety Audit (RSA) is required in the absence of a BCR (benefit/cost ratio), regardless of total project cost. Previously, in the absence of a BCR, projects less than \$40K did not require an RSA. The RSA is to be no older than 3 years. The RSA is not required where projects have a BCR (ie crash history). Councils have been granted two weeks (from 2/8/10) to submit any outstanding RSAs for projects they have already nominated for 2011/12 State Black Spot funding.

# 8. Roads 2025 (Annual Review)

- Kevin Ketterer (Albany) advised the meeting that City of Albany has undertaken a study of the road network in C of A and depending on the results will submit roads for inclusion or exclusion to the GSR Roads 2025 Strategy. These inclusions/exclusions will be submitted at the next GSRRG meeting in Nov 2010.
- Reinstatement of North Stirling Rd (extension of Toolbrunup Rd) Cr Pech (Gnowangerup) advised meeting that he noticed that North Stirling Rd had not been included in GSR Roads 2025 as a road of regional significance. The issue was discussed and resolution will be achieved by the next GSRRG meeting.

# 9. General Business

Flood Damage claims made by Local Government in 2009/10.

- Kevin Ketterer (Albany) advised the meeting that C of A has a claim pending with FESA. 70% of the claim was rejected by FESA due to the inclusion of salary and wages paid for "ordinary time worked" in the claim. Ms Michelle MacKenzie (WALGA) will seek clarification from FESA as to what information Councils need to provide and what is eligible and ineligible expenditure in relation to the provisions in the Western Australia Natural Disaster Relief and Recovery Arrangements (WANDRRA).
- A Certificate of Completion (used for Road Projects, State Black Spot, Nation Building, Direct Grants and TIRES) now needs to be completed for Damage Claims detailing actual damage costs incurred by the Council.

### Main Roads Projects

 Chester Pass Pass Rd (Moingup Springs) costing around \$7.5M is the first stage of the Upgrade Chester Pass Rd Strategy. Yet to hear from State Government on the Strategic Grain Review Process in relation to the quantum of funding if any will come from that process. In the next couple of weeks, MRWA is calling for public tenders and work will commence this summer (2010/11).

- Muirs Hwy Stage 4 (\$3.2m of Safer Roads funding) is the last section of reconstruction and passing lane project from Mt Barker to Mt Barker Denmark Rd.
- Fitzgerald National Park Upgrade project (\$16m in 2010/11).
   Delivered 3.6km section (East Mt Barron) Hopetoun end of Hamersley Drive.
- Intersection improvement at Bakers Junction (junction of South Coast Highway) which will also tie in to Bon Accord Rd (State Black Spot funding) and Network Improvement funds (\$700K)
- \$2m of bridgeworks
- Reseal program is around \$2.7m. MRWA has a large reseal backlog but MRWA has been able to make significant inroads with that level of funding.
- Integrated Services Arrangements (ISA)
  - Briefly mentioned at previous GSRRG meetings
  - Reasons for undertaking the ISA
    - MRWA to drive and manage asset management of the road network.
    - Previously MRWA had a relative hands off approach with the form of contracts it had for the last ten years.
    - Great Southern and South West Regions are the first two regions to roll in to a new arrangement for maintenance delivery.
    - The selected preferred proponent was Road Care. Southern Road Services (SRS), the people who are currently delivering the TNC have also been successful in winning the tender for the ISA, SRS was an entity just for the previous arrangement. SRS is in fact RoadCare.
  - Currently, MRWA is in an interim ISA where it is bedding down commercial arrangements and other operating processes and principles.
  - The interim ISA has run for 9 out of the 12 week period. MRWA is two weeks away from putting up the formal recommendation to award.
     MRWA will be looking to cut over to full service in late October 2010.
     RoadCare has co-located with MRWA in Albany and Bunbury.
- Andrew Duffield has offered the use of MRWA's meeting rooms including the Stirling Room (large conference room) to Local Government at no cost.
- Kevin Ketterer, City of Albany enquired about funding on the Albany Ring Road
  - Andrew advised that there is no funding for the Albany Ring Rd as per the last budget cycle. It is one of many projects that MRWA has put up in front of State Government to progress with some funding. Estimates for Stage 2 and 3 of the Ring Rd is \$110m.

### WALGA Report (Ms Michelle MacKenzie)

- Negotiations are continuing with MRWA in relation to the proposed new
   State Road Funds to Local Government Agreement. The two parties have agreed to new principles
  - 1. Focussing on State systems and Asset Management.

- The 2005-10 State Road Funds to Local Government Agreement has been extended for one year to 30 June 2011. The new agreement, once signed off will run from 1 July 2011 to 30 June 2016.
- There should be some performance indicators to monitor how well the new agreement is going. There are difficulties in setting them up straight away. It is envisaged that within twelve months, the State Advisory Committee will create Performance Indicators based on expenditure.
- 2. The GSRRG is working well, but one cannot plan a road network in isolation with other transport modes.
  - Over the life of the new agreement, the ten Regional Road Groups will evolve and be thinking about the broader transport issues. Local Government needs to think carefully about that because we don't want to destroy the integrity of what the strengths of the Road Groups are.
  - MRWA and WALGA agree that there needs to be an increase in the road funding pool in Western Australia. The current funding structure for the Local Roads Program is that 27% of vehicle licence fees are allocated to Local Government with the balance allotted to Main Roads. As vehicle fees increase, road funding to Local Government and Main Roads will increase. However, State Government nullifies the increase to MRWA's funds by offsetting it with a corresponding reduction to funding from MRWA other income streams. Looking at strategies for promoting the idea that MRWA needs to get their funding increases from vehicle license fees without having a negative impact on its other funding sources.
- Grain Freight Structure
  - Cr Pech (Gnowangerup) is the Great Southern Zone delegate representative on the Local Government Grain Infrastructure Group.
  - Wheatbelt, Great Southern and Mid West Development Commissions have provided funding for WALGA to pick up some of the findings in the Strategic Grain Network Report. The Government Report found that there is a need for funding to bring Local and Main Roads grain haulage routes up to a certain standard.
- At the Local Government level, there are issues in terms of the way the heavy haulage permits and access to routes are currently managed. The Grain Group elected member delegates have been lobbying for funding. The feedback from State Liberal and Labour representatives is that Local Government has to get it's own house in order. In seeking more funding from State Government, Local Government is aware that work needs to be done on agreeing on the strategic routes and sorting out heavy vehicle

access policies across the regions so there is consistency. WALGA has appointed Cardino to do some work – taking the map in the State Government Report down to a number of workshops across grain growing regions and Councils to say ok – if we have an assumption that local roads should immediately get the freight to the nearest main road or the nearest rail – do these routes in your municipality work and does your heavy vehicle access policies support those routes?

- The outcomes of the work is that we have a network of local transport groups that support Main Roads and that policies that Councillors have around heavy vehicle access support those groups. Also be looking at how the Functional Road Hierarchy will relate to that.
- Once those routes have been sorted together with Council access policies, standards will be discussed and unit costs determined so consistency can be achieved. WALGA will then go back to State Government with the map and total cost based on a unit cost that the sector agreed with the justification for seeking additional funding.
- The State and National Road Forums/Conferences will be held in Bunbury from 13th to 15<sup>th</sup> October 2010.

### RoadWise Report (Andrea Smithson)

 In conjunction with the Roads Forum in Bunbury, the Local Government Road Safety Awards will be presented. Strongly encourage Councils to consider projects they wish to nominate for consideration of an award. Nominations close on 27 August 2010.

The awards will be presented in the following categories:

- Safe Roads and Roadside
- Safe Road Users
- Safe Speed
- Safe vehicle
- Individual award for a "road safety champion" within Local Government.
- There is a State Road Safety Forum and awards on 6 September 2010.
   Great opportunity to hear about what is happening in road safety in Western Australia.

### Regulatory Signs and Lines Preliminary Review

- When the GSTWG has its site inspections of Road and State Black Spot projects, it doesn't always have the full designs to look at and review.
   Main Roads has to approve the designs prior to construction. It is preferable to get agreement in the design phase rather than waiting with the signs trucks on site.
- Steve Gash (Kojonup) enquired as to the turnaround for design approvals to be granted. Andrew responded with the fact that its signs and lines component that we are referring to not the geometric issues that MRWA has concerns with. It's about the number of chevrons a Council might

have on the project or the set back of hold lines at intersections. It is really about making sure that regulatory signs or regulatory lines are compliant. For small projects there is a couple of weeks turnaround. The designs are reviewed at the MRWA Albany Office and recommended to the Executive Director in Perth to approve.

### Funding Cap Issue

- Chair Savage expressed disappointment in the fact that City of Albany has taken the capping issue to the media and there have been letters sent to the Minister for Transport trying to pre-empt what the GSRRG is going to decide at this meeting today. If the GSRRG is unable to resolve this issue in house it may have to accept something imposed upon it.
- A lengthy discussion took place which commenced with the fact that City
  of Albany has been unhappy with the capping system since its inception in
  2002. The course of action adopted by the City was determined at a full
  Council meeting (consisting of 12 councillors).
- The options discussed at GSRRG meeting today -
  - 40% capping with a base allocation of a \$100k per Council.
  - 30% capping
  - 25% capping in 1<sup>st</sup> year increasing to 30% the next year on the
    understanding that C of A fully recoups the year 1 grants in that year
    without carryovers (unless there is an extenuating circumstance
    precluding the Council from doing so).
  - Cr Wolfe (Albany) suggested that it would accept 30% capping effective from the 2010/11 financial year. There was opposition to this proposal from Councils on the grounds that the 2010/11 Project Grant Program has been approved and that budgets for each Council have already been approved and committed.
  - Cr Altham (Kent) moved the following motion Motion: There be a base allocation of \$100K granted to each of the twelve Councils, with the remainder of the pool to be project based, but no one Council is to receive more than 40% of the pool. Moved: Cr Altham No seconder Motion lapsed
- Motion from Cr Beeck (Gnowangerup)
   Motion: For 2011/12, increase capping from 20% to 25%, review it to ensure funds have been fully recouped/acquitted in 2011/12, then increase capping to 30% for 2012/13 and beyond.

Moved: Cr Beeck

Seconded: Cr Rees

Lost 8/3 (net 75%)

### Speakers for:

Cr Beeck (Gnowangerup) "it is a reasonable offer and a compromise. If the capping was to get to 40%, I see it being unworkable for the GSRRG". Cr Rees (Katanning) the motion gives a reasonable compromise. A graduated step to 30% is a reasonable compromise. A graduated step to 30% is a reasonable offer.

 Motion from Cr Wolfe (Albany) to amend Cr Beeck's motion to read "capping to be 30% for 2011/12 and beyond".
 Moved: Cr Wolfe Seconded: Cr Wakka Lost 8/4.

With Cr Wolfe's motion being lost, discussion reverted back to Cr Beeck's motion – Cr Beeck closed the debate by saying "City of Albany should see this motion as a step forward. To reject this motion would mean that it will probably go to the Minister or go to the Courts, either way, it will be the worse case scenario for the GSRRG".

Speaker against – Cr Wolfe (Albany) – The City would accept 30% in 2011/12 but not 25%.

Speaker against – Cr Clements (Plantagenet) – unable to vote on any motion other than the options put forward in City of Albany's letter.

Chair Savage has requested that Council Delegates be in a position to resolve this in house by next GSRRG meeing on 8 November 2010.

### Amendment of the Transfer of Land Act 1893

### **CENTRAL COUNTRY ZONE**

### Guaranteed Levels of Funding for the Country Local Government Fund

That the WA Local Government Association be requested to discuss with the Department of Regional Development and Lands the development of a policy to give local government a guaranteed level of funding, under the Country Local Government Fund, irrespective of the level of royalties' income received by the State Government.

That the Western Australian Local Government Association be requested to approach the State Government seeking an ongoing commitment for a minimum of 50% of the Royalties for Regions Country Local Government Fund to be retained as a direct allocation to individual local governments.

### Water Services Bill

That the Water Services Bill Synopsis of Key Issues Report be noted and the Central Country Zone urges WALGA to strongly promote during the consultation phase of the Water Services Bill to source additional funding for small sewerage providers to ensure such operations are viable and that Local Government is adequately financed to comply with the licensing requirements, particularly in the area of asset management.

# More Local Governments to Form Regional Groups

Two more local governments have formalised their participation in the State Government's local government reform program. A Regional Collaborative Group (RCG) agreement involving the **Shires of Murchison** and **Upper Gascoyne** was signed on 24 September 2010. This adds to the RCG agreements already finalised in the Pilbara, Kimberley and the Gascoyne regions.

There are over 70 local governments engaged in the Government's reform agenda with 33 signatory to an agreement. **The Town of Narrogin** and the **Shires of Narrogin**, **Cuballing**, **and Wickepin** have also resolved to form a Regional Transition Group and are expected to formalise the agreement soon.

# **New Resource for Strategic Planning**

New Integrated Planning and Reporting Framework and Guidelines have been launched by the Minister for Local Government. The document outlines good practice for local governments to undertake long term strategic community plans supported by corporate business planning; financial planning and asset management.

Over the coming months, the Department will be holding a number of workshops throughout the State to acquaint CEOs, Mayors/ Presidents, elected members and administration staff to the framework and to gather feedback on how it can be applied. It is expected that there may be some revisions to the framework as this feedback is received. ## Implementation Committee Update

The Local Government Reform Implementation Committee continues to make important progress in driving local government reform.

At its meeting on 29 September 2010, the Committee endorsed two resources to be made available to the sector. One of these is the Integrated Planning and Reporting Framework which will assist local governments in undertaking strategic planning. This resource was launched by the Minister at a forum on Local Government Reform on 20 October 2010.

Another resource that will soon be released is the Human Resources and Change Management Plan. The Plan has been endorsed by the Committee and is expected to be made available in the coming month.

The attraction and retention of staff is recognised as an ongoing issue facing the sector where specific assistance is required. With this in mind, the Committee has extended the Terms of Reference for the Human Resources and Change Management Working Group to encompass consideration of broader long term initiatives, including workplace planning and the recruiting and keeping of staff.

## Local Government Services in Indigenous Communities Update

The Local Government Services in Indigenous Communities Planning Committee held its first meeting on 23 September 2010.

With representation from WALGA and other relevant State and Commonwealth government agencies, its role is to guide the planning, scoping and costing of local government services in Indigenous communities across Western Australia.

It's intended that the committee will form small working groups as required to address legislative and governance matters, the development of communication and community engagement plans and the drafting of an implementation agreement.

# **Key Policy Initiatives**

The Local Government Reform Steering Committee report was released in September and recommended that a number of complex issues be referred back to the Department of Local Government for further work.

Accordingly, the Department is currently conducting research and developing policy papers on the following proposals:

- that the legislation be amended to accommodate the creation of 'arm's length' local government enterprises (LGEs) to undertake property development and general commercial activities;
- that a model constitution be developed under the Associations Incorporation Act 1987 to allow local governments to form not-for-profit entities that would deliver services as proposed in SEAVROC's preferred subsidiary model, whilst maintaining appropriate levels of governance provisions; and
- that the legislation be amended to clarify that Independent Living Units in the aged care sector should only be exempt from rates where they qualify for subsidies under the *Commonwealth Aged Care Act 1997*, and that any such amendment be phased in over a five-year period.

The sector will be kept informed and consulted as these policy matters are progressed.
