Mr Lynn addressed Council in regard to Item 6.0 retail trading hours and raised the following questions?

- 1. What did you, as a Councillor think was the intent of the motion on seven day trading, at the last meeting?
- 2. Was it to maintain the current status of trading in the City and gradually 'ease in' further changes during summer months over the next three years?
- 3. Was it to change the present criteria and close down all trading on Thursday nights and Sunday's between May and November for the next three years?
- 4. By voting against the motion, was it to stop all trading for stores employing more than ten staff on the floor to cease trading on a Sunday during the period May to November?
- 5. By voting against the motion, was it your intention to support the Officer Recommendation?
- 6. A motion that can allow such a wide interpretation of its intention is poorly drafted and should be rescinded.
