 Bees are considered livestock and all beekeepers within Western Australia must be registered and their stock identified in accordance with the Biosecurity and Agriculture Management (Identification and Movement of Stock and Apiaries) Regulations 2013. This registration is issued by the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD) Brands Office.
