Planning your park and fly travel

From 1 January 2017 passengers departing Albany Regional Airport will be required to pay for parking if you decide to leave your vehicle at the airport. The system is a simple pay and display ticket system, with users pre purchasing the required length of stay and clearly displaying the ticket on the vehicle dashboard. Fees are charged at a rate of \$8.80 per day with the first four hours free of charge. The ticket machines are card only and do not accept cash and coins. If you are planning to park and fly from 1 January onwards please ensure you have pre-paid the required amount before boarding your aircraft to avoid penalty enforcement.

Picking up or dropping off passengers

The first four hours of vehicle parking are provided free of charge to continue to encourage family and friends to pick up and drop off passengers, however you will still be required to collect and display a ticket on your vehicle dashboard for these times. Please ensure you collect and display your free four hour ticket in order to avoid penalty.

Public parking bays are clearly highlighted on the map overleaf.

Why paid parking?

The airport is an expensive asset to maintain and Council is focussed on being able to ensure the long-term upkeep of the aerodrome with the least financial impact on ratepayers. The current free parking and no parking limitations is placing pressure on the availability of public parking spaces and often forces some travellers to park their vehicles on grass verges. Paid parking will dampen demand and allow better management of the public parking areas while avoiding the need to undertake significant additional capital cost to expand public parking infrastructure. The \$8.80 day rate is one of the cheapest paid parking rates of Western Australia's regional airports and considered a reasonable fee for service.
